Hospice shop No. 10 opens

ST CATHERINE'S Hospice has hit the perfect 10.

The charity, which relies almost entirely on public help, has just opened its 10th charity shop.

The new Filey shop is based in the former home furnishings Beddy Buys business on the corner of Belle Vue Street and John Street and is the first shop the hospice has opened in the town. Hospice retail manager Sunny Stansfield said: "We had volunteers straight away - people in the town have been absolutely fabulous."

"We are now trying to give all our shops a lick of paint ready for the summer and we have had one or two volunteer painters coming in to help, which is great. People are so kind."

Although the final figures have not yet been totted up, it is expected that once again the hospice charity shops have made well over £300,000 for patient care in the past year.

Sunny, who has two grown-up sons, believes that their success is thanks to more than 400 volunteers who put in hundreds of hours every year in the shops.

She said they were the best around and helped make the shops in Whitby, Bridlington, Hunmanby, Malton, Pickering, Driffield and the three shops in Scarborough hugely successful.

"It is the dedication of the managers and volunteers - without that we'd be nowhere at all," she said. "We have a team that is second to none."

"I have worked for Barnados and Help The Aged before and the difference is unbelievable. We are a small charity and it's just like working with a big family."

"We are all there for one reason and that's to raise money for patient care."

Like most of the people who work for the hospice Sunny has been busy taking things from the sites in Scalby Road and North Marine Road to the new complex in Throxenby Lane.

She said she had been "blown away" by the new facilities.

"The facilities for patients are so amazing - I think 'wow, this is it'," she said.

"It's the most wonderful feel-

ing. I think it's the most awesome place and I think the facilities are unbelievable. There's even a gym for the physiotherapists. I have been to some 10 or 11 hospices and the facilities at Throxenby Lane are the best I've ever seen.

"There isn't a member of the hospice team who doesn't feel like me. We are so proud to be able to offer this to people."
